The freeways here have 130kms speed limits. I saw lots of cars easily exceeding that. We saw some beautiful country today. The clean green manicured countryside we traveled through shows a pride which one does not always see in other countries. What we found particularly beautiful were the bright yellow rape crops contrasting with green fields and blue skies. Solar and wind farms were everywhere, The steel struts of a couple of turbines looked odd. After 5.5 hours of concentrated driving we are close to the Polish boarder. Another 4 hours tomorrow should almost get us to Makow and family. The last couple of days has been very relaxing and 3 days of eating, drinking and chatting are still to come.
