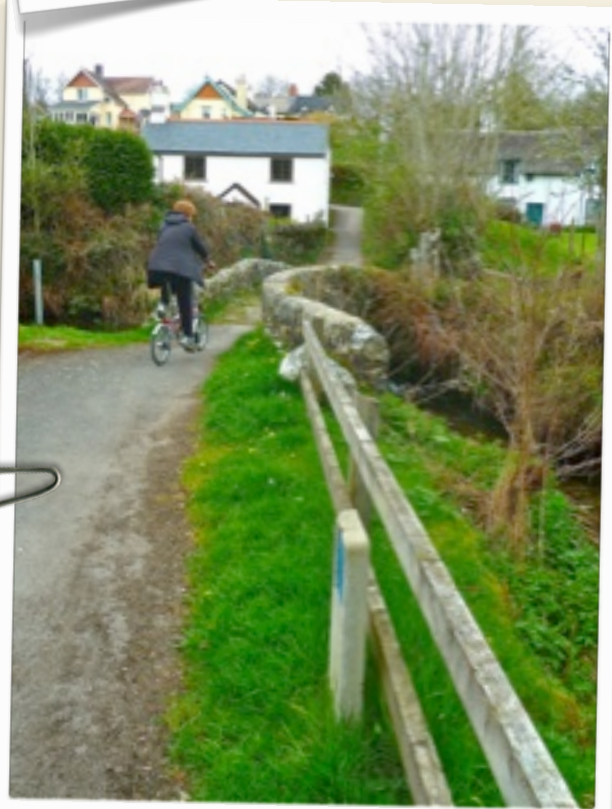


A trip to remember
