The Long Road to Longreach

Longreach is in the heart of Queensland's 'mulga country'. The trees around here are stunted and gnarled. After 3 days we have traveled 1250km. We still have 2500km to Darwin from here and are only now realizing how big this country really is.

We read that the outback country of Queensland is rich in flora and fauna. Over our three days we have seen lots of cotton, maize and sorghum crops, fewer and fewer trees, flat uninspiring landscapes that seemed to go on forever and a large number of road kill (mainly kangaroos and a spiny anteater and goanna or two) which appear to sustain large numbers of crows and eagles.

At Mitchell yesterday we stopped and had lunch. The main street was dotted with amazing bottle trees - really large round trunks that seemed out of place in Australia. The place was very quiet - I imagine most country towns are dead on Good Friday.



Visiting Your Own Back Yard.

We have talked often about what countries we would prefer to visit before we die. We have no real desire to visit USA or parts of Asia or India. South America is not really on our radar either but China might be. We get asked by friends why we want to travel to far away countries when there is so much to see right here in Australia. stage in life when we run out of money for international travel., or we get too old for these long trips. After 3 days on the road we are now not so sure.
