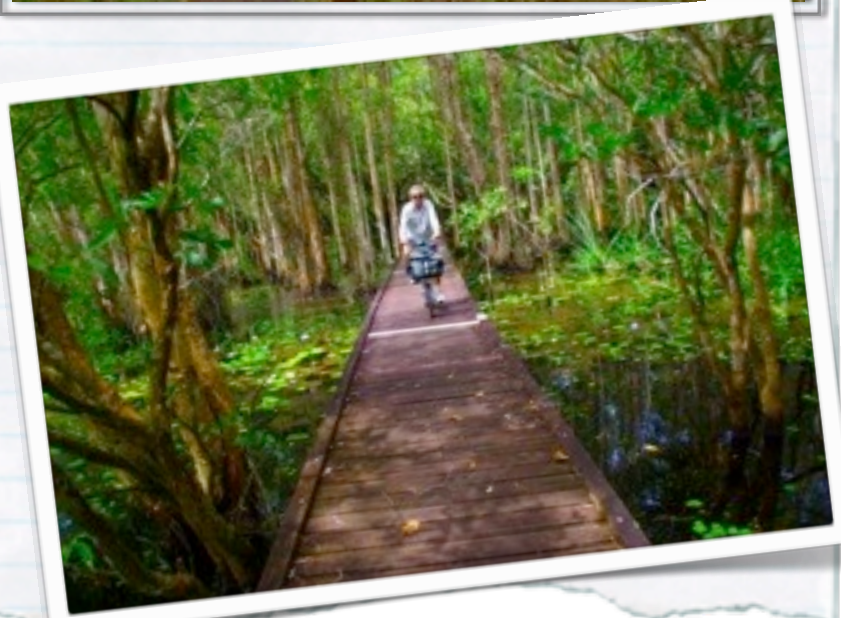


OUTBACK ADVENTURE

Mary River Region

We are now in the Mary River region, just outside Kakadu National Park.
